have a repertoire ranging from retro jazz, pop and classical arrangements to Christmas a cappella. They are adept performers on the concert platform, at festivals, private parties and corporate events.

The group's performances in London have ranged from St Martin-in-the-Fields, the Royal Albert Hall and the Café de Paris to the Houses of Parliament and the Pizza Express Jazz Club in Soho. The five outstanding vocalists also perform internationally, most recently appearing at the Teatro dal Verme, Milan. Apollo5 has broadcast live on Resonance FM and BBC Radio 2. The group has recently worked in partnership with The Sixteen, The National Portrait Gallery and St Martin-in-the-Fields in presenting an exciting new festival, 'Sounds Sublime'.

Apollo5 is part of the charitable foundation Voces Cantabiles Music, and is involved in its innovative education programme aiming to inspire creativity through music. The programme, led by VOCE58, reaches 20,000 young people annually, working in over 200 schools in the UK, France, Sweden, the USA and Asia. This October Apollo5 conducted a singing workshop at the Knights Templar School in Baldock where the group's soprano (and former Weston resident) Charlotte Brosnan had been head girl.

Apollo5 visited us last in November 2012 and are returning by popular demand! Their wide-ranging programme includes everything from Poulenc's 'Salve Regina' and Holst's 'I Love my Love' to 'Java Jive' and 'Boogie Woogie Bugle Boy'.

The foundation has its home at the Gresham Centre, in a beautiful Wren Church in the heart of the City of London. In partnership with the Diocese of London, VCM is establishing a hub for excellence in education, outreach and the performance of vocal music.
